

TOWARD PARTNERSHIP WITH ABORIGINAL PEOPLE

This workshop will help you build or improve the relationship between yourself or your agency and Aboriginal people, and explore how we can all become more effective in working together.

It is presented as two integrated modules:

Day 1 (1:00 - 4:30) *A glimpse of traditional Aboriginal culture.*

Focussing on Nyoongar traditions, Noel Nannup will guide us through the stories, spirituality, dreaming and knowledge of the Aboriginal people in the South West. As a result, you will feel more connected with our land and our place, and be introduced to the concept of 'working together to care for country' as a key in building partnership. You will also glimpse the sophistication and effectiveness of the world's oldest living culture, and explore what has, and has not, been lost as a result of European settlement.

This module will be led by Kim Bridge and Noel Nannup.

Day 2 (8:45 - 4:30) *Understanding and improving our relationship.*

This module explores the issues - past and present - that impact upon the relationship between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people today. You will be directly involved in exploring how to improve the relationships.

You will be moved, inspired and challenged by this experience, and will find ways - small and large - to be part of the solution in your own family, community, organisation or nation.

This module will include segments on:

- Our past, and how it affects us today
- Experiencing and surviving colonisation and dispossession
- Moving beyond policies and practices of dependency
- Keys to effective communication
- Finding our own solutions

This module will be led by Kim Bridge and Tim Muirhead, with a moving and informative presentation by Sandra Hill

The Trainers

Kim Bridge is an Aboriginal trainer and consultant with an extensive background in collaborative community and economic development

Tim Muirhead is a Non-Aboriginal trainer with an extensive background in community development, and a particular focus on building better understanding and relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people.

Noel Nannup is a Yamatji/Nyoongar man, with extensive knowledge about traditional culture and stories.

Sandra Hill - a Nyoongar woman who tells a powerful story of one family's journey through the 20th Century.
